Change how you think about a sponsor

A candidate's sponsor is many times an afterthought, a person of convenience, or a person of tradition. I'm challenging each candidate to think of their sponsor as more. Don't think of them as a "guide" leading you through the Confirmation journey, but rather think of them as a "partner" walking with you and experiencing with you every step of your journey.

Sponsors should offer advice, examples, and suggestions, but what's most important is that they walk beside you; not in front of you and certainly not behind you. Remember it's your journey not theirs.

The ideal sponsor:

- has/builds a relationship of trust with the candidate.
- meets regularly with the candidate as he or she prepares to celebrate Confirmation.
- communicates with the Youth Minister the spiritual needs of the candidate when appropriate.
- offers their faith journey as advice, example, and suggestion to the candidate.
- is someone in whom the candidate can confide.
- is open, honest, caring, committed, and encouraging; helping the candidate grow in his or her understanding of the faith.

The following is a list of suggested activities you may participate in to support the candidate.

- Get to know your candidate and their family.
- Pray for the candidate.
- Invite your candidate to pray with you.
- Share your own spiritual journey with your candidate.
- Take the candidate out...to a movie, dinner, a sporting event, etc.
- Attend the 4:00 PM Sunday Youth Mass together with their family.
- Read Scripture together and find out his or her favorite readings; share yours.
- If you are involved in a ministry, invite your candidate to join you.
- Encourage your candidate to keep a journal about his or her spiritual experiences and share yours. If you do not have one, work with the candidate on getting started.
- Pray for the creativity of the Holy Spirit to guide you in ways to build a *lifelong* relationship of trust, love, and faith with your candidate.
- Ask to sit in on a Sacrament Prep session or two.
- Volunteer to lead or participate in a Holy Encounter (Adoration, Penance Service, Retreat)
